SAC program is open Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Friday 6:00am - 7:30am and 2:30 pm - 6:30 pm. Thursday SAC is open from 6:00am - 7:30am and 2:30pm - 6:30pm. Saturday and Sunday the program is closed. During the school vacations, excluding federal holidays, Camp SAC is a full day of recreation programs, 6:00 am - 6:30 pm.

The SAC program for school aged children, Kindergarten -12 years of age, provides quality care before and after school, as well as a full-day camp during the winter, spring and summer breaks. The SAC program is aligned with the Boys and Girls Clubs of America. The goal of SAC is to introduce children to wholesome recreational activities and to the pleasure of Sicily's beautiful outdoors. Activities include storytelling, sports, arts and crafts, bowling, swimming, field trips, special guests and special events. Children are divided into age groups. During the school year, SAC is a Before/After school recreational program. Students are escorted to and from the elementary school.

SLO's will also link with services and programs delivered to Navy families in the Exceptional Family Member Program. They will be the primary advisor to commanding officers and staff on matters relating to schools serving the installation.

What Is Sure Start?

Sure Start (also referred to as SS in this text) is an exemplary, research-based preschool program that serves military children and families living overseas. In addition to offering a high-quality Educational program that reflects best practices in the field, Sure Start also provides health and nutrition, social, and parent involvement services. Close collaboration between families, schools, and the installation community is viewed as essential and a required part of the program. This multipronged approach to the delivery of services distinguishes Sure Start from all other DoDEA programs. At the same time, Sure Start ensures that participating children receive the same uncompromisingly excellent education that all DoDEA children are guaranteed. Sure Start's comprehensive model, although appropriate for all preschool children, targets preschoolers who are "at risk" for later school failure because of economic circumstance or other health and/or family factors. Because this innovative, effective model is expensive to replicate, it is reserved for those children and families who will most benefit from participating children with a sure start in school and later life.

Philosophy

As noted, DoDEA believes that with a sure start, children in all military families can develop the social/emotional and academic competence needed for productive, lifelong learning. The Sure Start preschool program is based on the premise that children's potential for learning is influenced by their early cultural, physical, social, emotional, linguistic, creative, and cognitive Experiences.

Because children who are identified as being at risk for school failure may have limited access to opportunities that enhance development in all domains, Sure Start provides children and families with an intensive curriculum that teaches requisite skills in a way that addresses children's is unique learning styles and intelligences. The Sure Start program is wedded to the beliefs that risk not destiny and that early intervention can ameliorate risk factors.

In summary, Sure Start staff and administrators believe the following:

- All children benefit from early experiences that are supportive of their ages and developmental capabilities, individual needs, and cultures.
- All children must have a healthy start in life in order to be ready to learn. All children learn best when provided with a safe and nurturing environment at home and at school.

• From the earliest age, children need to be exposed to rich experiences in language and literacy, mathematics, science, social studies, the arts, technology, and physical education so that maximum advantage can be made of the "windows of opportunity" for learning, as described by brain research.

Eligibility:

Sure Start's first responsibility is to the 4-year-old child (the child who turns 4 by September 1 of the enrolling school year of a military or eligible Department of Defense employee whose rank is Enlisted (E) E1 to E4; General Schedule (GS) GS1 to GS4; or Non Appropriated Fund (NAF), NAF 1 to NAF 2, *rank equivalent at the date of application. (Note that the application date is not to exceed six months before the first day of the following school year.) It is important to note that only the sponsor's rank is used to determine eligibility—not family income, unless it is used to determine rank equivalents for NAF Levels 1-4 or rank equivalent GS1- GS9. Any sponsor in the range of E5 to E9, GS5 to GS9 (**NSPS pay band 1, rank equivalent), or NAF 3-4, rank equivalent who wishes to apply for the program is eligible to do so with the understanding that first priority is given to those children whose sponsor is in the E1 to E4, GS1 to GS4 or NAF 1 to NAF 2, rank equivalent range.

Preschool Services for Children with Disabilities (PSCD)

Preschool Services for Children with Disabilities offers eligible young children with disabilities specially designed instruction, support, and services to meet their identified individualized learning needs. Current adopted DoDEA College and Career Ready Standards and curriculum materials for preschool are used to support the implementation of each child's Individualized Education Program (IEP). Curriculum and instruction includes focus on development of individual skills such as: expressive/receptive communication, language development, motor skills, and social skill development.

The purpose of special education services is to enable students to successfully develop to their fullest potential by providing a free appropriate public education in compliance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) as implemented by DoD Instruction 1342.12, "Provision of Early Intervention and Special Education Services to Eligible DoD Dependents."

ENROLLMENT ELIGIBILITY

Preschool Services for Children with Disabilities are provided for children three to five years of age who demonstrate an unexpected delay in developmental functioning when compared with the functioning of a nondisabled child of the same chronological age or have been identified as having a specific disability. Eligibility for PSCD is determined through a comprehensive evaluation process that includes standardized evaluation instruments and is confirmed by observations and professional judgment of early intervention or related services professionals.

Sigonella Middle/High School- is a Department of Defense Dependents School (DoDDS) serving grades 6-12 with a population of 326 students, located at the United States Naval Air Station (NAS) Sigonella, in Sicily, Italy. The base is situated in a large agricultural valley about 12 kilometers from Sicily's east coast near the city of Catania. To the north, Mount Etna, a 3,300 meter high active volcanic peak, makes a scenic backdrop for the base. The majority of our students are Navy command sponsored, with a normal tour of duty of three years. We have approximately 30 % turnover in student population each year due to military reassignment.

Our students are enriched by American and Italian cultures and have opportunities to travel throughout Europe for academic and athletic competitions. Our diverse American population is comprised of representatives from the 50 United States, as well as students from Germany and Norway. SMHS is an American high school in many ways, but is unique and different from the stateside schools as reflected in our extracurricular and special program offerings. Sigonella students reflect this uniqueness through their diversity and global viewpoint.
